CYBER BULLYING

EFFECTS OF CYBER BULLYING

Children who are bullied:

- may feel sad or alone
- may have no one to play with
- not many friends
- may feel scared and insecure
- may struggle in school to focus

WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK YOUR CHILD IS BEING BULLIED ONLINE

REPORT IT - game, school, CEOP

- Take screen shots
- Block the person involved
- Do not reply to any messages
- Make sure your child is ok
