

St. Paul's: Year 3/4 Curriculum Map – Spring 2

Catholic Social Teaching Topic Focus: That's not fair

Outcomes for the topic:

We will be able to describe characters thinking about our use of vocabulary.
We will know who the Saxons were and the impact they had on the UK today.

Mathematics Year 3

Children will learn to measure, compare, add, and subtract mass and capacity using kilograms, grams, litres, and millilitres. They will also begin to explore fractions.

Year 4

Children will learn to confidently add and subtract fractions. They will also explore the relationship between fractions and decimals, focusing on tenths and hundredths, and practicing dividing numbers by 10 and 100.



Science

This half term's Science topic will be Animals Including Humans. We will create models to help us to understand the human digestive system and investigate our teeth and their different functions. We will look at the skulls of different animals and how their teeth differ based on whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.



Art and Design/ DT

Art links to their history topic this term. Finding out about craft makers from the past Learning about the artefacts found in the Sutton Hoo Find. They will be building on their clay skills from year 1 and 2 and applying these skills to make a model of the Sutton Hoo helmet.

Computing- Repetition in shapes

Children will learn the fundamental coding concepts of loops and repeat and understand their purpose in programming. They'll also explore how these commands can be used to create shapes and execute sequences infinitely.

My Happy Mind Relate

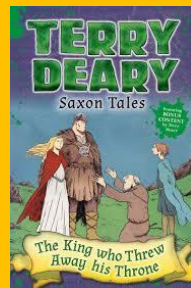
The children will learn that their strengths can be really helpful in friendships by helping them to accept other people's differences and how this is a good thing.



English Core Text: The King who threw away his throne.

During this unit the children will explore different character descriptions and then create their own character description of an Anglo Saxon.

The children will be writing a diary recount after an Anglo-Saxon battle. Exploring how language can affect the reader.



Music

This half term, we will continue learning to play the ukulele, focusing on playing chords so that we can accompany ourselves while singing. We are working towards a special performance for our families showcasing our hard work and new musical skills.

MFL/ Spanish Months, Birthdays and age

We will be revising months, dates and ages and will be learning how to ask someone when their Birthday is and how to say when we have a Birthday. We will be able to write simple familiar short phrases from memory, with understandable accuracy.

Physical Education

In REAL PE, we will concentrate on our creative skills; linking actions and developing sequences of movements that express our own ideas. We will look at sending and receiving skills with a partner.

In Gymnastics the children will be learning about counter balances and one class will be swimming.



RE

This half term we will be learning about Lent and Holy Week and how important it is to the Catholic faith.

We will explore forgiveness through the story of the Temptation of Jesus. We will share the Beatitudes and how these help us prepare for Easter.



History

Children will learn about the Anglo-Saxon period in Britain, from the Roman withdrawal in 410 AD to the establishment of Anglo-Saxon kingdoms and their cultural impact, including how they influenced modern place names.
