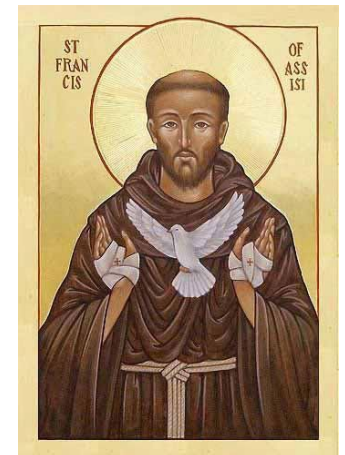
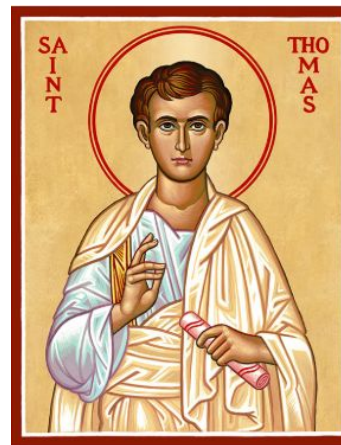
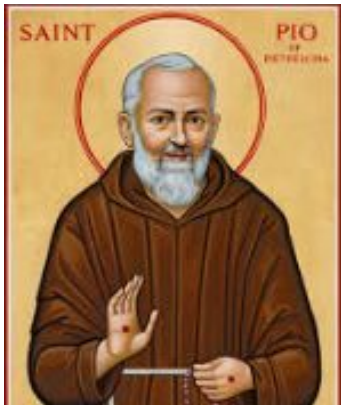

Welcome to Year 3/4



- Children should be in class and ready to learn, no later than 8:45am
- Children must be dropped off through the main school gate at 8:30m. If parents would like to speak to the class teacher, end of the day is best or ask the office for an appointment.
- Good attendance is essential for educational success. This includes, unless under exceptional circumstances, no holidays in term time



Home Work



- Children will be expected to read a minimum of 3 times a week and practise their weekly spellings. These will be checked weekly.
- If your child does not read or complete their spellings at home they will be expected to do this one lunchtime.
- Reading diaries will be sent home daily – please sign each time you hear your child read.

- Don't forget to check the website/ APP/ Facebook for other information and learning that is happening in school.



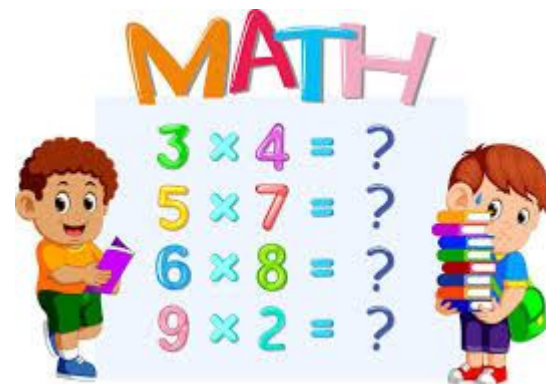

Year 4 Multiplication Test

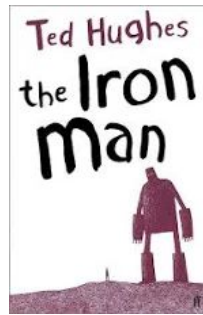
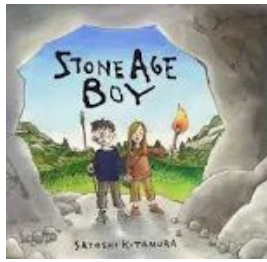
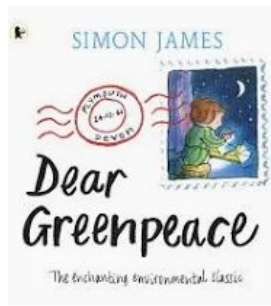
- At the end of year 4 all year 4 pupils will sit their Government Multiplication Test

- **78% of those who regularly came to the after school club got over 20/25**



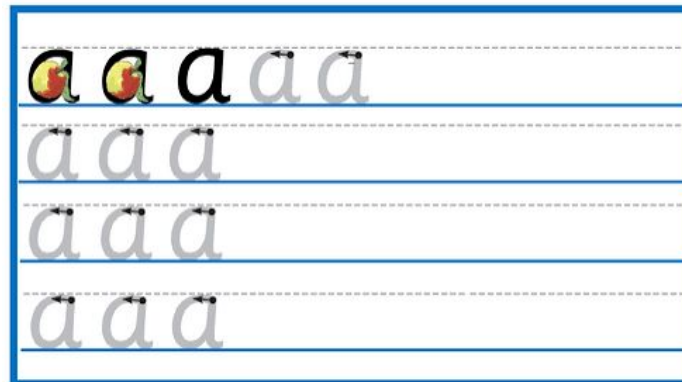
