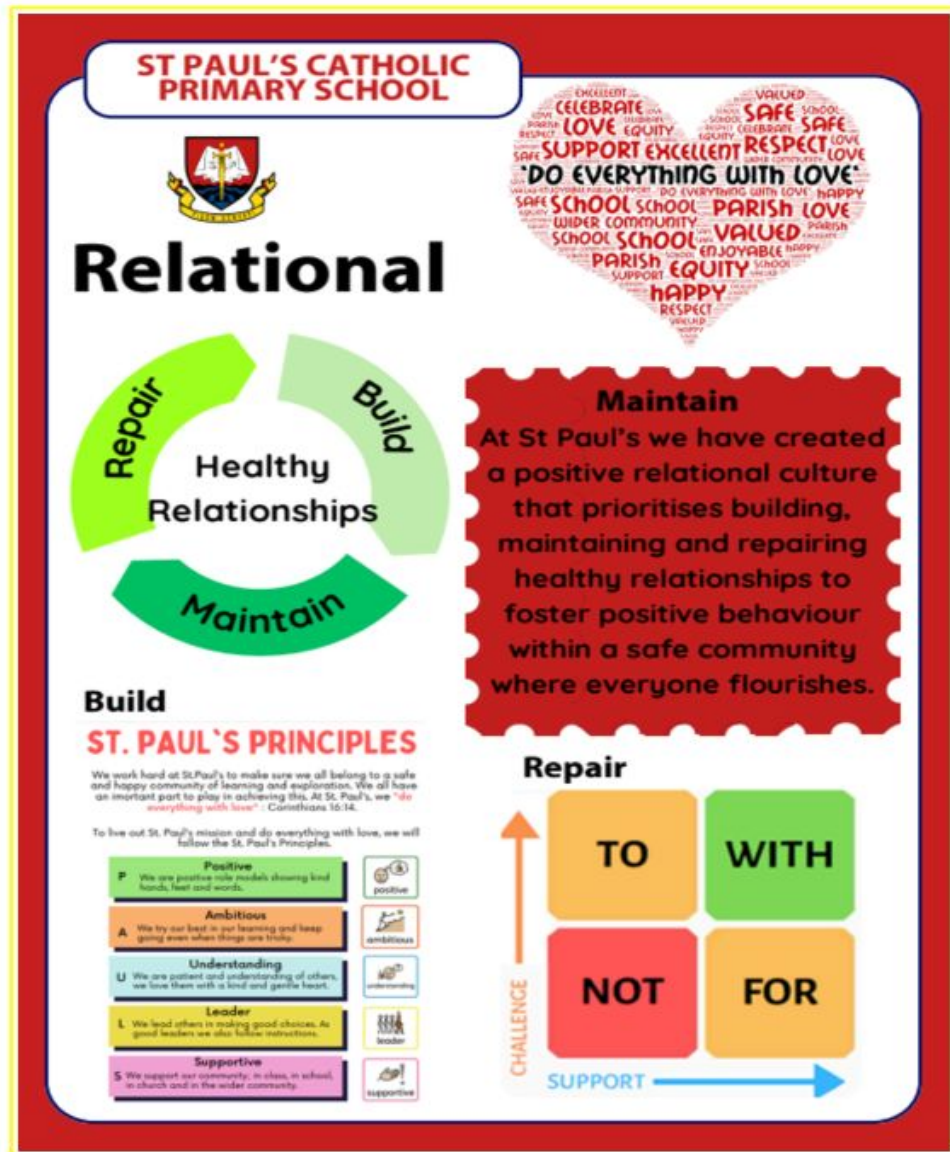

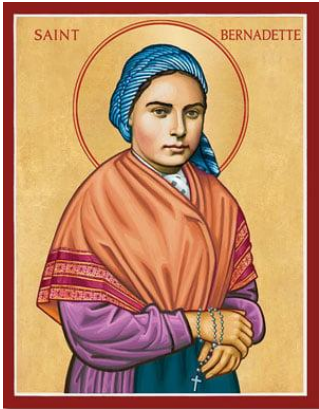

- ▶ In the Autumn term, children will establish their new routines and settle in.
- ▶ There will be one single year two class.
- ▶ We will teach the year two english and maths curriculum as a whole class.



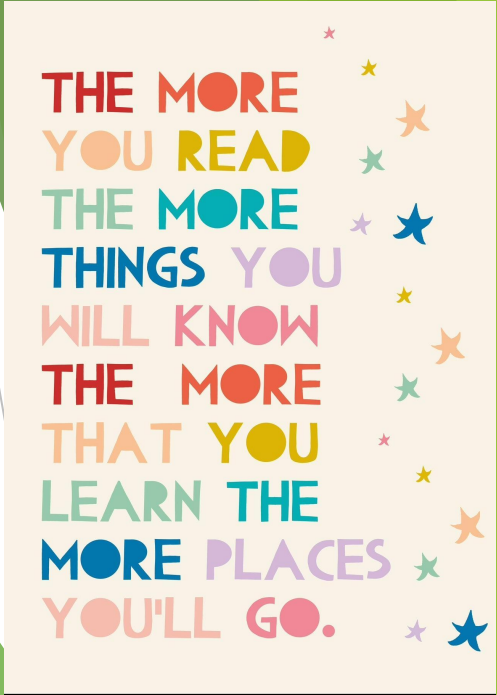
The shift from year 1 to year 2

- ▶ In foundation subjects, children will have adapted learning activities within each subject that have been carefully planned for them.
- ▶ We will teach year one national curriculum objectives, following on from last year's rotation of teaching the year two objectives.
- ▶ We will ensure the curriculum challenges the children and is adapted to suit their abilities.



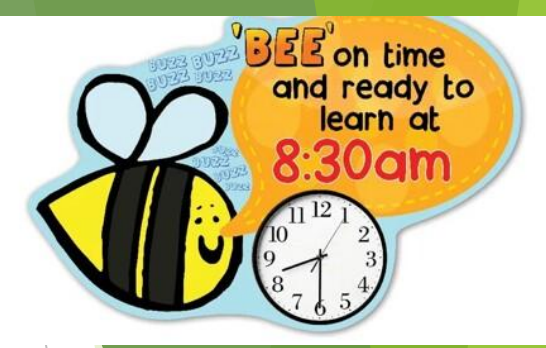
Home Learning

- ▶ Children will be expected to read a minimum of 3 times a week.
 - ▶ Reading diaries (these are for adults to record reading at home and allows us to reward regular reading at home)
 - ▶ Teacher's log children's reading so that those that do their homework weekly get a reward at the end of the year.
 - ▶ Spellings - Children will have spellings send home, based on their reading group. Completing this at home will help chn. with their english writing objectives.
 - ▶ TTRS - children will receive logins. The year 2 maths curriculum expects children to be able to count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s by the end of the year.

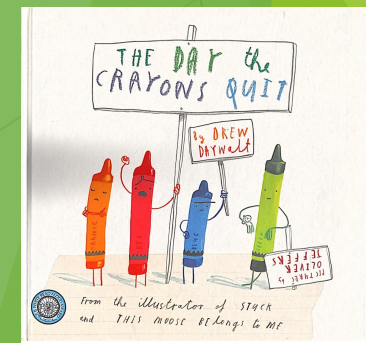
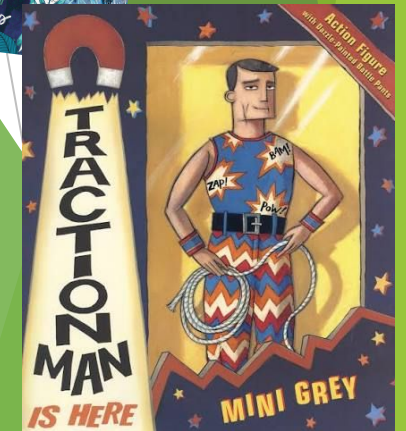
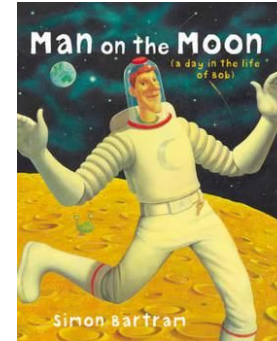
